Day 1 Top Attractions in Alexandria

Golavita travel expert guide will meet you at the agreed time at your hotel lobby to start your [Alexandria day tours](#) to some of the best Alexandria attractions. You will start with the newly opened Museum in Alexandria after 18 years of restoration since 2005.

Greco- Roman Museum

This museum was opened by Khedive Abbas Helmy II in 1895 to showcase the Greco-Roman artifacts that had been found in Alexandria up until that point and it's one of the best [attractions in Alexandria](#). In addition to a cutting-edge research and conservation facility and a multimedia hall, the Greco-Roman Museum currently offers thirty galleries in which to showcase its collection of

Greco-Roman artifacts. Ten thousand artifacts from the Greek, Roman, and Egyptian civilizations are on display at the museum. Legendary actors including Julius Caesar, Marc Antony, Ptolemy VI, Cleopatra, and Alexander the Great are on display at the Graeco Roman Museum. At the end of your tour of the Greco-Roman Museum, you will proceed to the next stop

Pompey's Pillar

Egypt has never produced a monolithic column larger than Pompey Pillar. It is housed in the god Serapis-devoted Serapeum of ancient Alexandria. Like the Hatshepsut Obelisk in Karnak, the column is approximately 27 meters tall and is composed of red granite from Aswan. It was a section meant for remembering, built between 298 and 302 AD as a tribute to the Roman emperor Diocletian. The location also contains a few artifacts, including a purification basin and a black basalt statue that was created during Hadrian's rule and depicts the bull-shaped god Serapis.

The Catacomb of Kom El Shoqafa

Now a well-known sight in Alexandria, [the Catacomb of Kom El Shoqafa](#) was formerly regarded as one of the seven marvels of the Middle Ages. It was utilized as a family tomb and dated to the second century AD. All things considered, the Catacomb blends elements of Greek, Egyptian, and Roman culture. At the end of your tour, we will drive you back to Alexandria Port.
